Effective Communication

Can we please ask parents to be mindful that staff are busy with children during the day and if you need to collect children earlier than the end of session that you let your children's room leaders know at morning drop off, in order for staff to prepare the children in going home early. This ensures they do not begin a new creative activity with your child just before they are about to leave.

New season

The weather is starting to change so can we please ask parents to ensure their child is dressed appropriately for the weather such as warmer coats, gloves that are waterproof and a warm hat. Wellingtons are advised on rainy days. Please also ensure your child's spare clothes bag is full as we do not want children in damp clothes during the day.

Please provide your child with comfortable indoor shoes (slippers) clearly labelled.

First Aid

Your child's safety and well-being is at the heart of everything we do at Oak Tree and I am delighted to announce that every member of the Oak Tree team are fully qualified first aiders, and trained in administering lifesaving treatments. Aureen, our fabulous nursery chef is the last one of the team to attend training which she will receive in November this year.

When you have written down your child's 'WOW' moment, please email them to the nursey or give them to the teachers in the room, so that the 'WOW' sheet can be shared in nursery and then can be added to the children's learning journey.

WOW MOMENTS:

- A first wee or poo in the potty.
- Drinking from a cup with no handles.
- Sleeping in their own bed all night.
- Riding a bike with/out stabiliser.
- Completing 5 metres for the first time without armbands.
- Your child may have written a letter of their name; or
- their full name for the first time by themselves.
